

all about How I Teach Math

Daily Math: Each morning all students are required to complete 5 math problems from various math standards and bring it to math class. In class, we review concepts that need reviewing, carefully comb through word problems and I give tips and tricks for calculations as needed. During this time, accuracy of calculation is emphasized! At the end of the week these packets are then collected and graded for a classwork grade.

Lessons: New lessons are taught daily and include note taking, written practice, online lesson participation, group work and then of course, homework!

We get a lot of work done in a short amount of time!

Test + Quizzes

Students are given ample notice of quizzes and/or tests. All review for tests is done in class as we work through the problems together to create an answer key. The expectation for studying includes reworking the problems on a blank review, using the answer key that was created in class to check answers, then, turn it in before the test.

It is important to note that each day, all of the answers to each Daily Math problem are gone over, explained and demonstrated to ensure that each student has a solid understanding of what was being asked. All students are guided to the answers AND are given the opportunity to fix any mistakes that they have made. I often offer extra credit points also, if a particular question is more challenging!

Technology Policy:

- All students and parents will sign the Chromebook Contract. This ensures the appropriate usage of, and care of our Chromebooks.
 - Chromebook use is a privilege at Seton Catholic School.

Homework:

Checked homework grades are placed in FACTS every week or so. Checked homework is worth 2 points per day, if turned in completed, on-time and with a name on it. Incomplete, late or no-named work is worth 1 point. Missing homework will be listed in FACTS and is worth zero points until it is turned in.
